




Attract new customers with a fun entry-level program

Being a college campus, teams fill fast and new players try broomball every year. It is marketed as a fun entrylevel program for students to get active and socialize. Wessman Arena also hosts the Twin Ports Broomball Association, an adult league that rents 3-4 hours of dirty ice every Sunday during the season. The absence of resurfacings is easy on staffing and helps increase the profitability of the program.

Broomball can also be used as a fun team-building event for local businesses looking to try something new that can include everyone. Coworkers get a chance to build camaraderie, learn new skills, and have lots of laughs.
